In accordance with the Bylaws Article XI, Sections 1100, and National Administrative Procedures Section 10020 the following is submitted for consideration by the body assembled at the 2024 National Convention.

CURRENT SECTION: Enclosure 3, Section V MARINE CORPS LEAGUE COVER

C. The Past National Commandants and Honorary Past National Commandants are authorized to wear a GOLD COVER with WHITE CROWN.

- The Past Chief Devil Dogs and Honorary Chief Devil Dogs are authorized to wear a GOLD COVER with a BLACK CROWN.

- Past National Vice Commandants of Divisions, Past Division Vice Chief Devil Dogs, Past National Executive Directors, and Past National Directors of Young Marines are authorized to wear a GOLD COVER with a GOLD CROWN. (Rev 2022) –

Past Department Commandants and Past Pack Leaders are authorized to wear a RED COVER with a GOLD CROWN. - Past Detachment Commandants and Past Pound Keepers are authorized to wear a RED COVER with a RED CROWN. –

All past officers listed above may identify their past office with a title strip or embroidery and may display the years that they held that office.

C. The Past National Commandants and Honorary Past National Commandants are authorized to wear a GOLD COVER with WHITE CROWN.

- The Past Chief Devil Dogs and Honorary Chief Devil Dogs are authorized to wear a GOLD COVER with a BLACK CROWN.

- Past National Vice Commandants of Divisions, Past Division Vice Chief Devil Dogs, Past National Executive Directors, and Past National Directors of Young Marines are authorized to wear a GOLD COVER with a GOLD CROWN. (Rev 2022) –

Past Department Commandants and Past Pack Leaders are authorized to wear a RED COVER with a GOLD CROWN. - Past Detachment Commandants and Past Pound Keepers are authorized to wear a RED COVER with a RED CROWN. –

All past officers listed above may identify their past office with a title strip or embroidery and may display the years that they held that office.

1.However, members who were elected to these positions and resigned from their office without completing a successful tour will neither be entitled to wear such title strip or embroidery denoting successful completion of their tour of duty nor entitled to conduct installation of officers.

2. Exceptions to this policy for circumstances where a National, department or detachment commandant becomes incapacitated or unable to perform due to diagnosed or prolonged illness or other unforeseen circumstances may be permitted and authorized by the Board of Trustees and detachment membership.

CHANGE RATIONALE: The title of Commandant at all levels (National, department and detachment) is a prestigious honor not to be taken lightly. When nominated, the individual was asked that if elected, would he/she accept the office and serve loyally, faithfully, and to the best of his/her ability during the term to which elected. When an individual fails to complete that service reflects negatively upon the themselves, the Detachment or Department and the League. The recent change of the Commandant's Medal, which was renamed to Past Commandant Medal at National, department and detachment level reflects the solemnity that is bestowed upon the office and its importance in the Marine Corps League structure. Only those persons elected and who served per our oath of installation should be permitted to wear the appropriate title strip or embroidery and also have the privilege of installing League officers at the appropriate levels.
